From the Deputy Principals

Dear MacKillop Catholic College Community,

We are now approaching the end of Lent on Holy Thursday, 24 March 2016. As the end of Lent approaches our students have been completing fund raising efforts to raise money for Project Compassion, the major fund raising activity for Caritas Australia, the charity we support in this season of the year. The theme for Project Compassion 2016 is "Learning more, creating change", and in line with Pope Francis comments that "Education is an act of hope", this year Project Compassion is concentrating on the power of learning to provide renewed hope to those children, women and men most vulnerable to extreme poverty and injustice.

We wish to warmly congratulate those students whose Homeforms have already completed major fund raising activities and offer our encouragement to those students whose Homeforms are still busily preparing for their activities to come to fruition. We would also like to offer our thanks to those many staff and family members who have assisted students with preparing for their activities. Any major fund raiser needs people who are generous and supportive whether through their donations of time, money or goods, or by purchasing the goods on offer, and our students and their families have certainly demonstrated their generosity in both forms!

Giving is important, but many of us concentrate on the help provided for others and overlook that giving is as important for us, the giver, as it is for those we are helping. Giving is a human thing to do. From birth our survival depends upon others giving to us everything we need, and this continues for many years. If our survival into adulthood is not possible without this giving by others, then, surely it is not possible to be happy without in turn having a habit of giving. In his second inaugural address as President of the USA and in the middle of a terrible civil war, Abraham Lincoln spoke of working "with malice towards none, with charity for all, with firmness in the right ..." People of all faiths understand and share this common belief in the importance of charity.

People of the monotheistic faiths understand that our creator is the author and giver of all good things. In the Letter of St James we read, "every perfect gift is from above" ... (and) ... "God's gifts put man's best gifts to shame." St Matthew reminds us how fortunate we are to give, because "freely you have received, freely give". Perhaps the hardest thing to do is to give without qualification or condition. In his two letters to the Corinthians, St Paul writes that "charity is kind" and "God loves a cheerful giver". His familiar passage from 1 Corinthians 13 about 'faith, hope and love' was previously translated as 'faith, hope and charity', and declares that without charity/love "I am a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal." (1 Co 13:1) It is though, only human not to always feel like giving. Shakespeare wrote, "I am not in the giving vein today" (Richard III) and in Hamlet, "For the noble mind, rich gifts wax poor when givers prove unkind".

"He gives twice who gives quickly" is an old saying that reminds us that the time to give is now! Our fulfilment in life results from generous giving rather than the corrosive desire for personal gain. About 160 years ago, the Christian thinker Etienne de Grellet reflected:

"I expect to pass through this world but once. Any good, therefore, that I can do or any kindness I can show to any fellow creature, let me do it now. Let me not defer or neglect it for I shall not pass this way again."

Visit from the Deputy Chief Minister

Last week we had a visit from the Hon Peter Styles MLA, Deputy Chief Minister of the NT. His visit coincided with an announcement that the NT Government was dedicating \$10 million to non-government schools as part of the "Boosting the Economy" package.

Upgrades, repairs and maintenance for Territory schools are the focus of this package, ensuring the widest possible community benefit from this spending. The \$10 million of funding provided to non-government schools will see new facilities built, upgrades to existing infrastructure, painting contracts and upgrades to water and mechanical systems brought forward, creating jobs for local businesses.

Greg O'Mullane, Deputy Director of School Services for Catholic Education NT welcomed the funding, particularly to the Catholic schools across the Territory.

He says the Boosting Our Economy package will give schools an opportunity to get projects on the go immediately and in turn; we will see improved infrastructure and a better operating environment for our students.

Mr Styles enjoyed his time at our College as he was shown around by our student leaders, who did a fantastic job as hosts. Thank you to all our students for displaying such exemplary behaviour during this visit, and for keeping our College looking wonderful.

We look forward to the opportunities to improve your educational experience that will be opened to us through this much appreciated funding, and thank the minister for taking the time to come and see us here at MacKillop Catholic College.

A huge congratulation to all Year 7 students who are currently wearing their uniforms so perfectly. It will be a tight contest for the pizza lunch at the end of term.

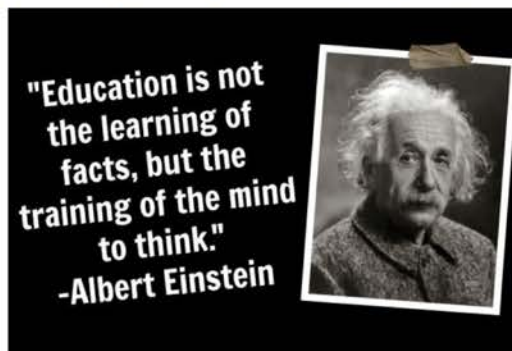

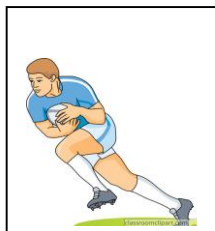
INVITATION TO ATTEND TRIALS – RUGBY LEAGUE 12 & UNDER
