If the arrangement form is not received and the payment arrangements are not honoured, please be advised that the Semester 1 reports will be withheld. To avoid this happening, please ensure the duly filled arrangement form has been sent to Finance and all payments, as agreed, are made on time.

Fee statements will be sent periodically throughout 2016 with the next statement due to be sent Week 4 of Term 2. This will include all charges for Term 2 Electives, the upcoming Netball and Ski Trip and the Back to School voucher for those families who have elected to use the voucher towards excursions or laptop levy.





### **National Consistent Collection of Data (NCCD)**

The Nationally Consistent Collection of Data (NCCD) is a collection of data from all schools across Australia about the number of students with a disability and additional support needs. It includes information about the type and level of support provided to them. This collection of data aims to inform the Commonwealth Department of Education about the additional support our school provides for students with disabilities and additional support needs, so that they have the same opportunities for a high quality education as students who do not require additional support.

All information provided for the NCCD has the student's details, removed so that the students are unidentifiable. A student's name, date of birth, year level and address is NOT included in the data collection. Some of the students we aim to include in this data collection are not diagnosed with disability even though they do receive additional support.

The data collection is being implemented nationally to enable a consistent picture of school students requiring additional support to assist schools, education authorities and governments to ensure that children receive the extra assistance they need.

In the event that any of your children receive additional support at school, we will include information about the support that they receive in the National Consistent Collection of Data 2016.





### Let's keep it safe on Territory Day!



### Fireworks can be fun but they are dangerous. Take care when using them by following these safety tips.

- . It is illegal to possess fireworks outside of Territory Day. Only buy what you can use on Territory Day.
- Use a sand bucket to stabilise fireworks and clear a 5 meter radius around the bucket. Have a hose or bucket of water ready for emergencies
- Avoid wearing synthetic clothing (e.g. nylon, polyester) when around fireworks as stray sparks can
- . Dud fireworks can still go off, leave them for 15 minutes and then douse with water
- . Never point, hold or throw lit fireworks and don't hold more than one lit sparkler at a time
- Supervise children at all times. Never give fireworks to children under 12 years of age.
- Alcohol can affect your judgement and coordination so don't drink before using firework
- If you receive a burn injury cool the area immediately by placing under cool running water or submerging in cool water for at least 20 minutes.

### ACCEPTABLE USE POLICY FOR STUDENTS' USE OF PERSONAL ELECTRONIC TECHNOLOGIES

#### **Definitions:**

- Electronic Devices refers to Personal Electronic Technologies and includes but not limited to MP3 & MP4 players, cameras, laser pointers, PDA's, mobile phones, voice recorders, video cameras, etc.
- College Refers to MacKillop Catholic College
- Staff Refers to MacKillop Catholic College Staff
- Parents Refers to those persons legally responsible for the student including Parents, Carers, Guardians etc.

### 1. Purpose

The increased ownership of electronic devices requires that MacKillop Catholic College Staff, students, and parents take steps to ensure that electronic devices are used responsibly within the College environment. This Acceptable Use Policy is designed to ensure that potential issues (such as mobile etiquette) and acceptable behaviour and good manners can be clearly identified and addressed.

The College has established the following Acceptable Use Policy for electronic devices that provides teachers, students and parents guidelines and instructions for the appropriate use of these electronic devices during College hours.

The College recognises that there are times when it is genuinely appropriate and useful for students to have access to electronic devices - for example: to confirm or change a collection time after school. It is neither necessary, nor acceptable however, for electronic devices to be switched on or used during the school day, i.e. between 8:15am and 3:05pm.

The Acceptable Use Policy for electronic devices also applies to students during College excursions, camps and extra-curricular activities.

### 2. Rationale

### 2.1 Personal safety and security

The College accepts that parents give their children electronic devices to protect them from everyday risks involving personal security and safety. It is acknowledged that providing a student with a mobile phone gives parents reassurance that they can speak with their son/daughter quickly at any time outside school hours. During school hours parents ring the office to make contact with their sons or daughters.

#### 2.2 Responsibility

It is the responsibility of students who bring electronic devices onto the College premises to adhere to the guidelines outlined in this document and directions of Staff. The decision to provide these electronic devices to their children should be made by parents and as such parents should be aware if their son/daughter takes the device onto the College premises.

The following acceptable behaviour and good manners apply with respect to mobile phones and other electronic devices:

- (a) Courtesy, consideration of and respect for others are paramount at all times.
- (b) They are brought to and kept at school, and used entirely at the owner's risk. The College cannot accept any responsibility for theft, loss, damage or health effects (potential or actual) resulting from mobile phone use. Students and parents should recognise, however, that these electronic devices are often highly prized targets for theft and, accordingly, should always be stored in a student's locker or in a safe and secure place.
- (c) Parents and students should ensure that such electronic devices are properly and adequately insured as personal property.

### 2.3 Acceptable Uses

Parents are reminded that in cases of emergency they are to contact the College directly. The College Office remains a vital and appropriate point of contact and can ensure your son or daughter is reached quickly, and assisted in any appropriate way.

Any student, who is feeling unwell at school and needs to go home, must arrange this through the Sick Bay located in the Administration building. Under no circumstances should students use a mobile phone to contact home and make arrangements to leave except through the College Office.

Outside the hours of 8:15am - 3:05pm whilst still on College premises, students should use soundless features such as text messaging, answering services, call diversion and vibration alert to receive important calls.

Non-observance or breaches of these rules may result in the electronic device being confiscated and privileges restricted or withdrawn. If the electronic device is confiscated it must be turned off prior to it being taken by the staff member. If the electronic device is confiscated for the third time, it must be collected from the College Student Reception area by the parent after school hours.

There are times when these devices are allowed for education/curriculum purposes. In these instances, the teacher will inform the leadership team and parents will be advised of the class (es), time, place and duration of use. In other words, usage for educational purposes is registered and restricted.

### 2.4 Unacceptable Uses

Electronic devices are to be switched off during 8:15am - 3:05pm and other educational activities such as band or orchestra or other school organised activities and assemblies. There will be no exceptions to this part of the policy.

Any student, who is feeling unwell at school and needs to go home, must arrange this through the Sick Bay located in the Administration building. Under no circumstances should students use a mobile phone to contact home and make arrangements to leave except through the College Office.

No student will have an electronic devices in their possession during an examination unless as a special provision as detailed by the Special Needs Coordinator and signed off by the Principal. At all times, they are not be used in any manner or place that is disruptive to the normal routines of the College or to other people. These guidelines also refer to the use of electronic devices during field trips, excursions or other off-campus supervised activities. This includes the sending and receiving of text messages, data, voice recordings and capturing images.

Electronic devices shall not be used to take photos in change rooms, toilets or in any situation that may cause embarrassment or discomfort to their fellow students, staff or visitors to the College. This includes the use of electronic devices to record motion/movie images and/or sound recordings.

Should there be disruptions to lessons caused by an electronic device; the responsible student will face consequences as sanctioned by the Principal. These consequences are listed below.

### 2.5 Theft or damage

Students are required to mark all their electronic devices clearly with their names.

In order to reduce the risk of theft during College hours, students who carry electronic devices are advised to keep them well concealed and not `advertise' they have them.

Students who bring a personal electronic technology device onto College premises should leave it locked away in their locker/bag as soon as they arrive or presented to student reception for safe keeping.

Electronic devices which are found in the College and whose owner cannot be located should be handed to front office/reception.

The College accepts no responsibility or liability for replacing electronic devices technologies that are lost, stolen or damaged whilst on College premises or at College sponsored functions.

The College accepts no responsibility or liability for students who lose or have their electronic devices while travelling to and from the College.

The College accepts no responsibility or liability for unauthorised phone calls or use of electronic devices by other students. It is the student's responsibility to keep their password/pin numbers confidential.

### 2.6 Inappropriate conduct

Any student/s caught using a electronic devices to cheat in exams or assessments will face serious consequences as sanctioned by the Principal or SACE Board as in the case for SACE Exams.

It should be noted that it is a criminal offence to use an electronic device to menace, harass or offend another person. As such, if action as sanctioned by the Principal is deemed ineffective, as with all such incidents, the College may consider it appropriate to involve the police. Hence, students with electronic devices must not engage in personal attacks, harass another person, or post private information about another person using SMS messages, taking/sending photos or objectionable images, voice recordings and phone calls.

Students using electronic devices to bully, harass or stalk other students will face serious consequences as sanctioned by the Principal.

#### 2.7 Sanctions

Students infringing on the rules noted above will have their electronic devices confiscated. It will be taken to a secure place within the College Reception. The device will be available after school hours from the Year Coordinator. In these situations parent(s) will be informed. The Home Form teacher and Class Teachers will be advised.

Repeated infringements may result in forfeiture of the privilege of the student to bring electronic devices to the College.

Infringements under section 2.6(c) may result in the matter being referred to the police. In such case the parent will be informed as a matter of urgency.
