As we near the end of Semester One students should be busy completing their work associated with their Semester One courses. Parents are encouraged to touch base with subject teachers if concerned about their son/daughter's progress. Certainly now is the time for communicating so as to avoid any surprises when reports are issued. Please encourage your son/daughters to complete all tasks to the best of their ability. Setting quiet time aside within home life for study cannot be recommended enough. Television off and phones put away is the best practice.

HOMEWORK

In setting homework the class teacher aims to:

- Encourage the development of independent study habits. A diary is compulsory for all students.
- Give parents an opportunity to share in their children's learning.
- Refine the student's skills of time management and organisation.
- Develop the student's sense of responsibility.
- Practise skills and reinforce work learnt in class.

GUIDELINES

- Homework is given at the discretion of the class teacher with regard to the age and ability of the children.
 Teachers are willing to negotiate homework expectations with parents so as to cater for the needs of individual students.
- 2. Homework will be set throughout the week. Recommendations for homework including assignments are as follows:

Year 7 - 3 - 3½ hrs / week
Year 8 & 9 - 4 - 6 hrs / week
Year 10 - 5 - 8 hrs / week

Year 11 & 12 - 9 – 12 hrs / week (at a minimum)

These are approximate times. The amount of time needed to complete homework will vary from week to week, and from student to student.

3. Homework may consist of the following:

Completion of class work, short overnight tasks, reading, music practice, research related activities and assignments, reading, revision/preparation for tests and consolidation.

- 4. It is the responsibility of the class teacher to communicate homework expectations to parents. Students are expected to complete homework. Students must bring a note from their parents if homework is not completed. Teachers will consult with parents if homework is regularly neglected.
- 5. The class teacher will monitor all homework.
- 6. Each student is required to note all homework in their student diary and have this diary signed by their teacher and a parent on a regular basis. (See the section on Diary use for details)

ADDITIONAL HOMEWORK TASKS FOR MIDDLE YEARS

1. READING

Reading is an important tool in the middle years. It not only develops fluency and accuracy in the student's reading and writing, it models more sophisticated sentence structure, develops a broader vocabulary, a better control and more creative use of language. It also provides opportunities to critically analyse text. Children should read for a set period each week.

2. BASIC MATHEMATICAL FACTS

As instructed by the year level mathematics teacher. An emphasis is placed on speed, accuracy and mental calculations, as well as problem solving.

3. SPELLING

Students are given strategies to help them spell and spelling practice is often included in the weekly program.

Uniform Expectations

All students are required to wear the regulation school uniform unless specifically notified that the uniform may not be worn. This is also necessary for our Workplace, Health and Safety requirements.

All students out of uniform should have a note, dated and signed by their parent/guardian, which explains why the item of uniform is not being worn. The only jewellery permissible is a watch, ear studs/sleepers (one stud/sleeper per ear) and a religious medal on a neck chain. Long hair should be neatly tied back. All belongings should be clearly marked with your son/daughter's name.

Out of Uniform Procedure

Uniforms must be worn correctly. If a student is out of uniform we ask that parents send a note to the classroom teacher indicating the reason why their son/daughter is out of uniform.

STAFF FIRST AID TRAINING

Providing the best care for students and staff in medical emergencies is important to us all at MacKillop Catholic College. Teachers and School Officers are undertaking training in Senior First Aid Course with St John Ambulance on Saturday 28th May and Saturday 4th June. Staff also completed their annual CPR updates on Saturday 28th. Staff trained in Asthma Management and the use of Epi Pens.

PARENT REMINDER REGARDING FIRST AID AND MEDICATIONS

Students who require medication during school hours need to have written permission from parents.

Medication need to be in the original packaging complete with dosage and students name and should be deposited with the First Aid staff in the Front office (not kept in bags or lockers). Parents need to complete a copy of the MEDICAL FORM which is available from the Front Office staff. Students can report to the office at the required time to take their medication.

Panadol will not be given to student and parents will be called if students present to sick bay and are too unwell to return to class.

Students requiring ongoing medication, are Asthmatic, have a severe allergy or require an Epi Pen need to lodge a MANAGEMENT PLAN with the First Aid staff at the Front Office and provide the required medication. This plan should be written in consultation with a registered medical professional. The Asthma Foundation can provide suitable documentation for those with Asthma.

The focus for this term is Diary use. The diary is an important tool and assists students in organising their week, homework, assignments and study. It is also a great way for teachers to communicate with parents on a daily basis. Students should be bringing this diary to every class and taking it home every afternoon. We are asking students to have this diary signed by a parent or guardian at the end of each week. The class that demonstrated the best use of the diary and the most signed diaries will be earning themselves a pizza lunch at the end of this term.

A reminder that mobile phones are not permitted at school between 8.30am and 3.05pm. Students are welcome to hand their mobile phones into the office for safe keeping if they need them to and from school or alternatively, students must have their phone switched off and kept in their bags or lockers. If students are found using their phone during the above hours, the phone will be confiscated and locked in the safe in the office. 

STAGE 2 HEALTH - STUDENTS WORKING WITHIN THE COMMUNITY

Through our Stage 2 Health subject we have been investigating mental health and smoking in the community. We focused on the year 10 cohort to raise awareness, educate and offer support for these unhealthy coping strategies. To raise awareness and understanding we created an informative foyer display, developed and distributed pamphlets and organized guest speaker appearances. During Pastoral Care on Monday, the year 10s welcomed in three clients from the Sunrise Drug and Alcohol Rehabilitation Centre to discuss the impacts that drugs and alcohol had had on them. The professional staff that joined the clients in speaking to the cohort offered a further insight to the effects that these substances can have on the body. To address the mental health issues, we organized for Headspace to speak on another Pastoral Care assembly, where students were offered a deeper understanding of the signs, strategies and services available for dealing with anxiety, depression and suicide.

We enjoyed working within the community to assist with identifying and addressing these issues and look forward to similar experiences in future careers. The Bachelor of Education Secondary Teaching (Music) graduate now teaches music at MacKillop Catholic College in Palmerston.

"I have an interest in the connection between mathematics and music," she said.

"Music is mathematical in many respects. Mathematics can be a particularly abstract subject, which some students struggle with, but its application within music is very real and something they can experience in a practical way.

"Rhythm has a basis in maths, for example."

Ms Ezzy said she was passionate about promoting music education in the Territory.

"Nearly everyone can sing but a lot of kids hold to a misconception that they can't.

"It's often because they haven't had a go."

Ms Ezzy said that while she studied classical piano at CDU, she loved playing in both classical and contemporary styles.

"I sing, write songs, play bass guitar and drums as well as the piano," she said.

"I played in rock bands while at uni and intermittently play percussion with the Darwin Symphony Orchestra when they need an extra percussionist."

A high-achiever, Ms Ezzy received outstanding academic achievements awards twice during her undergraduate years and also was a CDU student ambassador.

She said she was grateful for a NT Government teaching scholarship, which allowed her to offset her course fees.

"I was one of the blessed ones. It means I don't have a debt," she said.

Ms Ezzy graduated at a ceremony at the Darwin Convention Centre last week.

BRING THEM HOME MEDIA RELEASE 26 MAY 2016 WELCOMING REG HILLIER HOME

Most Australians were unaware that 25 Australians killed in the Vietnam War were never returned home. They were buried in Malaysia (Terendak Cemetery) and Singapore (Kranji Cemetery).

In May 2015, the former Prime Minister, the Hon. Tony Abbott MP, announced an offer of repatriation to the families of 35 Australian service personnel and dependants in the Terendak Military Cemetery in Malaysia, and to the one other Australian serviceman who died in the Vietnam War and who is interred in the Kranji War Cemetery in Singapore.

The Royal Australian Air Force will bring the returning Australians home to RAAF Base Richmond, where they will be received in a formal military ceremony on 2 June. This will be immediately followed by a private memorial service for the families.

Reg Hillier's relatives will be among those families at the ceremony in Richmond on June 2, along with the Bring Them Home National Project Director, Bob Shewring. Reg Hillier was the only Territorian killed in the Vietnam War. Reg was never returned home as his next of kin could not afford the cost they were asked to pay. He was buried in Terendak Cemetery along with 23 other Vietnam war dead.

To honour Reg's service and ultimate sacrifice, Reg's relatives and the Bring Them Home team would like to invite all Territorians to attend the following services.

Murray Valley Encephalitis warning for Darwin

30 May 2016

The Top End is on high alert for Murray Valley encephalitis (MVE), following the recent detection of high level MVE virus activity in sentinel chickens in the Darwin rural area.

As a result of the discovery, Top End residents are being urged to protect themselves from mosquito bites to stay safe from the potentially fatal MVE virus.

High virus activity was detected in sentinel chickens located in the rural area through the Flavivirus Surveillance Program run by the Department of Health (DoH) in liaison with the Department of Primary Industry and Fisheries.

Medical entomologist, Nina Kurucz said MVE virus can be transmitted by the common banded mosquito. It is expected the highest risk of transmission will last until the end of June.

Although routine mosquito surveillance traps set in Darwin by DoH last week collected relatively low numbers of the common banded mosquito, relatively high numbers of the mosquito occur in rural areas close to wetlands and lagoons.

The common banded mosquito is active at night.

Ms Kurucz warned that rural areas could expect the greatest mosquito numbers. She said this was because fish and other predators had little or no access to pooled water where the insects breed and mosquito control activities were not possible.

Since surveillance for MVE began in 1974, a total of 36 cases had been recorded Territory wide. Close to 20 per cent of cases had been fatal while a further 14 per cent of patients suffered permanent severe impairment.

Ms Kurucz encouraged people to cover up, use repellent and avoid outdoor exposure around mosquito prone areas, such as creeks and wetlands – especially after sundown, until the end of June.

To minimise the risk of mosquito borne disease you should:

- · ensure that children are protected against mosquito bites
- avoid outdoor exposure around dusk, and at night, within 2 km of swamps, creeks, rivers, billabongs and other flooded or low lying areas
- use mosquito coils, mosquito lanterns, and apply barrier sprays containing bifenthrin in patio and outdoor areas near houses
- use mosquito proof accommodation and camping facilities at night


- · wear light-coloured clothing with long sleeves, long trousers, and ankle protection with socks
- use a protective mosquito repellent containing 20% DEET or picaridin and apply as per label advice. Gels and creams usually provide better protection.

National Consistent Collection of Data (NCCD) 2016 Communiqué: Parents & Schools

The nationally consistent approach to data collection provides all Australian schools a clear picture of the number of students in schools with disability and additional support needs, as defined by the Disability Discrimination Act (DDA) definition. The reasonable adjustments that are provided to students with disability and additional support needs through consultation with parents/carers, enable students to participate in education on the same basis as their peers.

The collection includes information about the type and level of support provided to students from Transition to Year 12. This collection of data aims to inform the Commonwealth Department of Education and Training about the reasonable adjustments our schools provide for students with disability and additional support needs.

The information provided to the Commonwealth Department of Education and Training does not identify the student, as the collection requires each State and Territory to send a numerical figure for all students provided with support under the DDA. Students included in the data collection do not need to have formal diagnoses of disability even if they receive additional support.

Authority for the collection of information for the purposes of the NCCD The Australian Education Regulation 2013 (the Regulation) (www.comlaw.gov.au/Details/F2014L01723) requires all government and non-government schools to provide information to the Commonwealth Department of Education and Training for the purposes of the NCCD.

The information that is provided is set out at subsection 58A(2) of the Regulation. This includes, in relation to each student with additional support needs and disability at a school:

- the student's level of education (i.e. primary or secondary)
- the student's category of disability (i.e. physical, cognitive, sensory or social/emotional)
- the student's level of adjustment (i.e. support provided within quality differentiated teaching practice, supplementary, substantial or extensive adjustment).

The information will not identify individual students (subsection 58A(3) of the Regulation); no information that could reasonably enable the Departments to identify individual students will be provided by schools.
