From the Principal



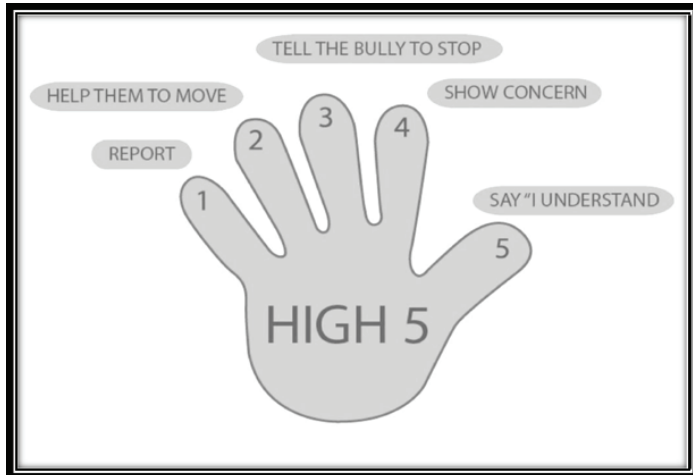

MacKillop Catholic College is committed to providing a safe, happy and caring environment which fosters respect for others and promotes personal growth and self-esteem for all. Over the past few weeks, in a proactive rather than a reactive measure, teachers have been providing education and awareness training to students regards bullying. In some situations surveys have been done to give us real data with which to work.

Our education program stresses that in the first instance students use the HIGH 5 strategy. That is,

When Someone Is Bullying You



When Someone Is Bullying Someone Else



Following this they have three major responsibilities in this area:

- To “tell” if they were bullied or they see someone else bullied – both at school and on the way to and from school;
- To help someone who is being bullied; and,
- To not bully others.

Bullying undermines the dignity of each person and is an infringement of our values and is unethical and illegal. Because we are committed to looking after each other we are encouraging our students to act positively and help those who they see being bullied.

At present we have a Harassment policy which outlines the aspects of aggressive or intimidatory behaviour directed towards individuals because of specified social characteristics, such as racial harassment, sexual harassment and harassment directed towards individuals with a disability and also bullying. As a College we have an Anti-Bullying policy that deals specifically with peer victimisation and the consequences associated with this. Our aim with the support of the College Board is to provide the very best learning environment for all our students.





The Significance of the Sacraments

Simple gestures can carry immense power. Jesus frequently used signs to communicate great truths to people of his time. Catholic tradition acknowledges there are seven sacraments: Baptism, Confirmation, Eucharist, Penance or Reconciliation, Marriage, Holy Orders and Anointing of the Sick.

Baptism welcomes a person into the Christian community. Baptism is necessary to receive any other sacrament.

The seven sacraments of the Catholic Church use this physical world with purpose. Water, oil, human touch, incense, bread and wine are all employed in touching the sacred. We cannot see God but we can see fire, we can hear the words, we can touch. We can feel oil and water, smell incense. We can embrace one another in peace. The celebration of sacraments recognizes the deep need we all have for concrete ritual as a way of experiencing the mystery of a gracious and tender God.

If you have been Baptised and wish to be Confirmed classes commence soon in the Parish for those Year 6 and older.

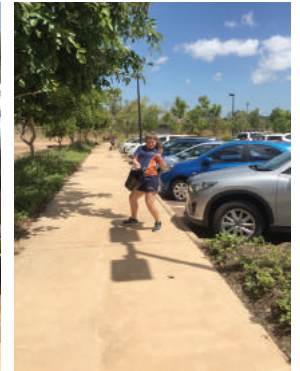

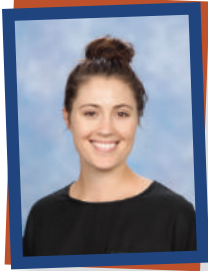

Take Care of Your Teeth

Oral Health Services NT encourages all Territorians to take the first step on the road to good oral health by following the five key oral health messages of “stay, play, brush, eat and drink well”. These Messages focus on encouraging regular dental check-ups; wearing mouth guards when playing contact sports; twice daily brushing; eating healthy food; and drinking lots of waters.

All Territorian families can access dental services by either contacting their private dentist or for eligible clients, the public dental service at Oral Health Services NT. Children of families receiving the Family Tax Benefits are also eligible to access the \$1000 of dental treatment available through the Child Dental Benefit Scheme. This can be done either through the family’s private dentist or through the Public Dental service.

In the Northern Territory, families with children from birth to 18 years who attend secondary school, can access public dental services by phoning 89226466 (Top End) and 89516713 (Central Australia)
