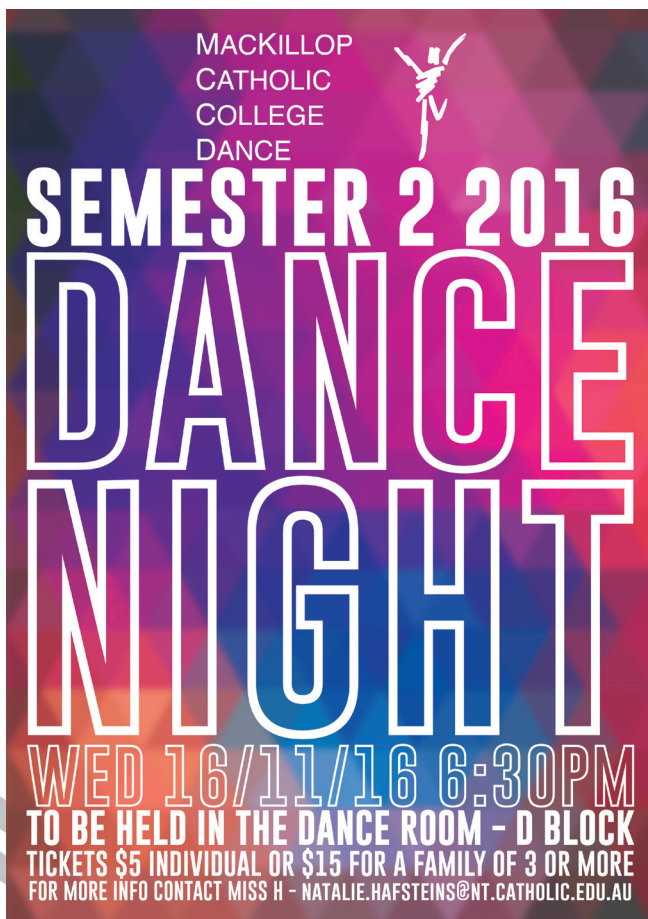

The students engaged in a design brief which necessitated the planning and development of a project based on a mailbox. Their innovative designs were wonderful to see.

Our Stage 1 Material Products students have been developing their skills and understanding of using composite materials with a focus on metal, to produce their projects. The Stage 1 Communication Products with Mrs Pineiro are currently developing their skills in website design. All of these students are being encouraged to continue with building their skill levels and to begin thinking of some possible ideas that they may be able to work on for their Stage 2 projects. Special thanks is extended to Ian Anderson and Roy Levers who provide invaluable support to so many of our students.

Mr Dimmick's Year 10 metal and wood classes are engaged in some challenging design work and it is great to see their level of enthusiasm and creativity.

Mrs Woodward has her classes actively engaged in both the Textile and Food Technology classrooms. In Textiles the main focus is towards Christmas craft and clothes for Summer. He recently arrived in Darwin after coming across from Indonesia, after traveling through Europe, the Middle East and Asia. I turned 23 on this trip.
