"Then, in my dreams of the Last Day, Our Lord will come back and reward us for having, by his grace, straightened the world out, and having the poor competent and the rich thoughtful and the well-protected kindly and gener-

ous and involved, and the educated enthralled with the kingdom of God, and the spiritual able to perceive him in such a way as to make him visible to us."

These are the words of a Jesuit priest who died in a very poor, black area of Washington DC, where he gained a wonderful reputation for creating shelters for the homeless, providing meals and medical, dental and legal help. Among his papers after his death at age 80 was found this note which he had written to himself. It sums up well our hopes for all students being informed, being involved and making a difference.

World Teachers' Day was inaugurated on 5th October 1994, by the United Nations Education, Scientific and Cultural Organisation (UNESCO) to commemorate the 1966 joint signing of the UNESCO/ILO Recommendation concerning the Status of Teachers. In adopting this recommendation, governments unanimously recognised the importance of competent, qualified and motivated teachers in society. Celebrated in over 100 countries, World Teachers' Day acknowledges the efforts of teachers in an increasingly complex, multicultural and technological society. All Saints Day THURS 1st NOVEMBER

All Saints Day, the day on which Catholics celebrate all the saints, known and unknown, is a surprisingly old feast. It arose out of the Christian tradition of celebrating the martyrdom of saints on the anniversary of their martyrdom. When mar-



tyrdoms increased during the persecutions of the late Roman Empire, local dioceses instituted a common feast day in order to ensure that all martyrs, known and unknown, were properly honored. Our College will celebrate a special Mass for ALL SAINTS' DAY on Thursday morning at 8.30am. Parents and friends of the College are welcome.

All Souls Day FRIDAY 2nd November

Often overshadowed by the two days preceding it, Halloween (October 31) and All Saints Day (November 1), All Souls' Day is traditionally a time for the Christian community to remember deceased family members and friends. All Souls' Day was first instituted at the monastery in Cluny in 993 CE and quickly spread throughout the Christian world. People held festivals for the dead long before Christianity. It was Saint Odilo, the Abbot of Cluny in France, who in the 10th century, proposed that the day after All Saints' Day be set aside to honour the departed.


YEAR 7 EXCURSION
