Dear Members of MacKillop Catholic College Community,

Recently, I read that the most important thing we need to do each day is pray and reflect. Our year sevens enjoyed this change of pace and time to reflect throughout the Year Seven Retreats. For this reason let us take a moment out and sit quietly with this powerful story:

Water the Sage

A great teacher was renowned for his wisdom and insight. People would travel great distances to meet and talk with him. He was most generous in sharing what he had discerned from his many years of prayer and learning.

One of his students asked him who had been his greatest teacher. The old Sage's surprising response: WATER

Water he explained is yielding but all conquering. Water extinguishes fire, or, finding itself defeated by flame, escapes as steam and re-forms as Water. Water washes away soft Earth, or, when confronted by Rock, seeks a way around it. Water corrodes Iron till it crumbles to dust; it saturates the atmosphere so that Wind dies. Water conquers by yielding; it never attacks but always wins the last battle.

Some Information as parents and students head towards Yr 11 in 2014

Year 11 and 12 students enrol in the NTCET.

The NTCET is an internationally recognised qualification, designed to recognise the knowledge and skills that have been acquired through formal education and training.

The NTCET provides students with access to flexible learning arrangements where students have increased opportunities to develop the business, interpersonal and employment-related skills needed for the future.

NT utilises the South Australian Certificate of Education (SACE) Board for the qualification of the NTCET. The qualification is certified by the Northern Territory Board of Studies (NTBOS).

In order to gain a Northern Territory Certificate of Education and Training (NTCET), students are required to complete 200 credits, which include:

- twenty credits of literacy, ten credits of numeracy (can be gained at Stage 1 or 2), ten credits of the Stage 1 Personal Learning Plan (the PLP is usually studied at Year 10) all at a C grade or above;
- sixty credits of Stage 2 subjects at a C minus grade or above (this can include VET that is recognised at Stage 2 level), and;
- one hundred and forty credits at a C grade or above.

Presently our Yr 10 students are undergoing studies in PLP.

Subjects for Yr 11 will be offered in nine learning areas (Arts, Business, Enterprise and Technology, Cross-Disciplinary, English and English as a Second Language, Health and Physical Education, Humanities and Social Science, Languages, Mathematics and Science).

Over the next few weeks we will interview every year 10 student with their parents to ascertain subject preferences for 2014. As a College we will endeavour to provide our students with their first choice. In year 10, students are limited in their elective choice due to the requirements of the Australian Curriculum (Yr 1 to 10) that dictates that it is compulsory for all Year 10 students to study: Mathematics, English, Science and History and as a Catholic School we have Religious Education. As well as this we need to cover PLP in readiness for year 11.

I ask that parents contact me directly if they are in anyway dissatisfied with the subject choice available to their students or if we are failing to meet our commitments to you and your children.

VET is recognised within the NTCET as are other community developed programs (e.g. Duke of Edinburgh's Award, Australian Music Examination Board music exams) and community learning. **We offer both Duke of Edinburgh Awards and Australian Music Examination Board music exams.** For details contact Brodie McCutcheon and David Graham respectively.

Students who enter the NTCET from interstate, overseas, with International Baccalaureate Diploma Program (IB) grades or as an adult student can apply to have their previous study recognised.

Modified programs can be offered to students with significant intellectual disabilities. Students are eligible to enrol in modified subjects if they have identified intellectual disabilities and will not be able to reach the performance standard.

In conclusion, the staff at MacKillop wish all in our school community God's peace and joy during the coming busy weeks. Thank you for all that you have done this year.

The day continued with fun and competition in the Staff v's Student Touch game and House Tug of War contest.










