



Geography Excursion

Casuarina Coastal Reserve

Year 7 and 8 attended a full day geography excursion to the Casuarina Coastal Reserve. Year 7's completed a creek study for the Rapid Creek area which included a study of the human impacts on the creek system. Students completed turbidity studies, examined mangrove health and growth and completed a series of soil tests. Year 8 students completed a coastal management study examining natural, cultural and man-made features of a coastal area. Students also studied the limestone cliffs and examined how different landforms are created by rain, waves and air. The students had a great time on their excursion and some wonderful discussions about human impacts on the local area have really opened some student's eyes to the fragility of our environment.


