Dear Members of the MacKillop Catholic College Community,

Welcome to another term. I come to this term having enjoyed the best part of 4 weeks in Peru travelling and observing firsthand the work of the Josephite sisters (the order founded by Saint Mary MacKillop).

Rod Plummer has done a mighty job holding the fort as Acting Principal in my absence. For this I formally thank him.

There are some things in life you just know you are meant to do. You can put it down to fate or destiny or, as I prefer to acknowledge, the guiding hand of God. Through this Pilgrimage, it has become clearer to me that the golden thread of

the Mary MacKillop Charism running through the narrative of our College aligns beautifully with a much larger landscape which was started over 150 years ago with our Patron Saint Mary of the Cross MacKillop. Her work now stretches across the globe to places like Peru, Timor and the Kimberley's and here in the Northern Territory. Her fellow sisters describe her as "a sunburnt saint who was not afraid to roll up her sleeves and assist those in need in practical ways such as the founding of schools and acts of charity." Mary MacKillop longed to help "the poorest of the poor" and to "never see a need without trying to do something about it". She worked tirelessly to make a difference, to uphold the dignity of the most marginalised, dejected and deprived.

The work of the Josephites continue to have as their central thesis the option of education for the poor and less fortunate. This charism must shape and colour the judgements and decisions we make here for our children in our school. The experience of the slums of San Rosa, Lima and Fe y Alegria School, Tarma, where there is no running water or sewerage, but the will to survive is driven and people are desperate to improve life for their children through education has added to our narrative here at MacKillop.

As a community we are the story tellers and story makers. How do we articulate our vision and build on this charism in our place and our time?

For this privilege, I will be forever grateful and can only say thank-you to all those who have shared this moment in history with me and those of you who looked after the school in my absence. Now we are back home may we all, like the Josephite Sisters, continue Saint Mary MacKillop's work by addressing the everyday needs of our families and our wider communities.

PERU PILGRIMAGE

Travelling through Peru over the past weeks has confirmed that Saint Mary of the Cross MacKillop is truly a remarkable and inspiring Australian saint and the Josephite sisters that work under her charism are equally remarkable.

These women bring hope, peace, comfort, intelligence and inspiration to the people they serve. They are ordinary hard working and dedicated women living their life like Mary did in an extraordinary way.

These women uphold the dignity of the most neglected in Persian society.

As we travelled through their schools and places of residence we were moved by their profound sense of gratitude like their foundress. Gratefulness / gratitude constantly displayed in actions and words. The schools at Motupe (House of Mary MacKillop) and at Tarma (Fe y Alegria) were schools for the poorest of the poor. The communities from which the children came had no access to running water or sewerage. The staff truly believed in 'never seeing a need without doing something about it" They embraced their challenges and went on with their work. The sisters journey in Peru has not been without struggle and heartbreak. The life story of Sr. Irene McCormack is testimony to this.

In Peru the sisters' work includes the provision of family services such as homecare, disability services, education, respite care and aged care.

Our travels took is from Lima to Capital to Tarma, Cusco, Ollantaytambo, Puno and Machu Picchu and back to Darwin. Covering many kilometres and to altitudes of around 4000 meters.

We felt like our Patron Saint Mary MacKillop who was an intrepid traveller, traversing vast distances to visit and support those who lived in remote areas.

Hopefully we have made a difference to those we have met along the way.

On Saint Mary MacKillop's tomb the words, 'Remember, we are but travellers here" are inscribed Feeling the pain of others is important because it strengthens our humanity and our connections to people as a whole, removing division and complacency. It may take a lot of time and practice but hopefully one day we may all be able to see past our barriers and into the eyes of our fellow human beings.

Thankyou Catholic Education, MacKillop families, staff and students for the opportunity to return with a heightened impression of the work of Saint Mary MacKillop imprinted on my soul.

Year 9.1 SOSE Excursion to the Territory Wildlife Park

Last Friday, 19th October, our Yr 9.1 SOSE classes travelled to the Wildlife Park as part of our Term 3 unit of work on Biomes and Ecosystems and as an ongoing interest in Australia's food security.

Our guides gave us some great information regarding the Monsoonal climate of Darwin and we were able to distinguish quite a few species of birds and some really noisy bats, as we made our way through the Monsoon Walk.

The Whip Rays located at the Sandbank were fascinating to watch and it was also highly informative to hear about their unique presence in the NT and how little is known about this species of ray.

Our visit to the aquarium strengthened our understanding of ecosystems and broadened our knowledge of coral reefs and the threat of acidity and temperature elevations of water.

This style of excursion is so enriching for students as they can see the physical aspects of the work they are studying and gain far greater knowledge of the topic.

Catching the 'train' to the destinations was fun- even for the teachers!





Information for parents and carers about NAPLAN going online in 2019.

Please note the following:

- The National Assessment Program Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is an annual national assessment for all students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9
- NAPLAN provides governments, education leaders, schools, parents and students with information on how Australian students are performing in the essential areas of literacy and numeracy.
- In 2018 the first schools around the country successfully performed NAPLAN online.
- It is expected that all eligible schools across the country will be using NAPLAN Online by 2020.
- NAPLAN Online will allow better assessment through tailored testing, more precise data on our students, faster turnaround of results and more precise measurement.
- It has been confirmed that the NT will start its implementation of NAPLAN Online in May 2019.
- The transition to NAPLAN Online will involve about 40 schools with high bandwidth internet participating in the first stage of preparation activities, which includes school readiness training in August and testing in September 2018 for most schools.
- Our school will be part of this first group of schools transitioning to NAPLAN Online in the NT.
- We will participate in platform readiness testing in Term 4 to ensure the updated platform for 2019 meets the needs of Territory students.
- We want NAPLAN Online to be a positive experience for our students, teachers and school community.

2018 Student Residential Address and Other Information collection notice

This notice is from the Australian Government Department of Education and Training (the **department**), to advise you that the department has requested that your child's school provide a *statement of addresses*, in accordance with the *Australian Education Regulation 2013* (Cth) (the **Regulation**).

A statement of addresses contains the following information about each student at the school:

- Student residential address (not student names)
- Student level of education (i.e. whether the student is a primary or secondary student)
- Student boarding school status (i.e. whether the student is boarding or a day student)
- Names and residential addresses of the student's parent(s) and/or guardian(s)

Schools generate a record number for each student for the purposes of this collection, which is also provided to the department.

Purpose of the collection

This collection is routinely used to inform Commonwealth school education policy, and to help ensure that Commonwealth funding arrangements for non-government schools are based on need, and are fair and transparent.

The National School Resourcing Board recently completed a review of the socio-economic status (**SES**) score methodology used in the calculation of the Commonwealth's needs-based funding arrangements for non-government schools. The information collected in the *statement of addresses* will be used to progress the Board's recommendations, which have been accepted by the Government.

Use and disclosure of personal information

Your personal information is protected by law, including the *Privacy Act 1988* (Cth). Any use and disclosure of your personal information relating to the *statement of addresses* will occur in accordance with the Regulation.

Your personal information may be used by the department, or disclosed to the Australian Bureau of Statistics (the **ABS**), for the purposes of SES score policy development, reviewing SES score methodology, calculating SES scores, Commonwealth school education policy development (including school funding), or where it is otherwise required or authorised by law.

For example, your personal information may be provided to the ABS for statistical and research purposes, which includes data integration projects such as the Multi-Agency Data Integration Project (MADIP). Further information on the MADIP can be found here:

The department may, from time to time, carry out audits of school submissions. In the event of an audit, contracted auditors may seek to compare a school's *statement of addresses* with student enrolment information held by the school. These contractors will not use the information for any other purpose.

The department may also be required to disclose your personal information to contracted providers for the purposes of the provision of ICT support services to the department.

The department does not intend to disclose personal information to overseas recipients.

What do you need to do?

You are not required to do anything. Your school is responsible for providing the requested details to the department, however, please ensure that your school has the most up-to-date and correct details for your family.

HPE Swimming Lessons

Dear Parents / Guardians,

The Health and Physical Education department will be focusing on swimming lessons for all year 7-9 classes in Term Four once again. There are many reasons why learning to swim and survive in water environments is important, and we have further improved on the program introduced last year to MacKillop.

Swimming lessons will start Thu week 1 in Term 4, at the Palmerston Swimming and Fitness Centre and offer roughly 7 sessions throughout the 9 week Term. Student swimming ability will be assessed during the first lesson and students will then be placed in groups according to their swimming ability. This allows them to develop water confidence and provides students with basic skills in water safety and survival. The lessons will be conducted during their usual double HPE lessons and align with the Australian Curriculum as follows:

Students are also encouraged to wear rash shirts in the pool for sun protection and hand in any personal medical items (e.g. asthma puffers) to staff each lesson.

Cost of Activity: The College student levy subsidises this course.

As per all curriculum classes, attendance is compulsory and non-compliance or truancy will be addressed. Our HPE team has an array of qualifications, experience and passion for swimming, which will be complimented by extra Inclusion Support Staff and qualified Lifeguards.

We look forward to offering this valuable learning experience to your child and ask you to return the attached form to support us with ensuring your child is best catered for through the Term 4 HPE swimming program.


