A warm welcome to all new families and welcome back to all existing families. Thank you for your support in 2018; I look forward to fostering a strong and positive partnership in 2019.

The first fees statement for 2019 will be issued latest by Week 5, Term 1. It will include charges for tuition fees, student levies, family levies and IT Resources levies. Electives and excursion charges (if any) will be charged at a later stage.

However, we encourage prior arrangement for payment of fees. In this regard, we have enclosed at the end of this newsletter Payment Arrangement form and Direct Debit Request Form. All forms should be filled and sent back to the finance email below for further processing. The statement will be sent via post and email; in case you do not receive it please get in touch with the finance team to update your details.

As per the terms of the Enrolment Agreement signed by all families, **payment of school fees is due within 21 days of the invoice date** (unless prior payment arrangements plans are made).

If you have a payment arrangement for payment of the fees, we expect the account to be finalised before close of the school year.

All families who have more than one student in Catholic Education in the NT are eligible for a sibling discount. To avail of this discount, a sibling discount form needs to be completed annually and sent to Finance. All families are also eligible for a Back To School Voucher of \$150 from the NT government to cater for costs such as uniforms, excursions and textbooks. Please fill in the attached form and forward it to us for processing.

Payments of school fees can be made via BPay, credit card, direct debit or cash payment at our front office reception and direct bank transfer to the below College bank account.

Permission slips for these events will be sent home with the students so please, keep an eye out for them and return back to me as soon as possible.







#### **Historic Flight Commemoration**

MacKillop was well represented at the recent commemoration of the 99th anniversary of the landing of Ross and Keith Smith in Australia, in 1919. School captain Zac Howe was accompanied by prefect Macinlay Maslin, and aircraft enthusiast Logan Gunn - all from Year 12 - at the commemorative ceremony on Monday 10 December.

The intrepid airmen made the voyage from the UK to Australia in 1919, winning an air race to show the viability of air travel.


Along with Sergeants Jim Bennett and Wally Shiers, they flew from Hounslow Heath Aerodrome, England, on 12 November 1919 in a converted Vickers Vimy WWI bomber, landing in Darwin Australia on 10 December, taking less than 28 days, with actual flying time of 135 hours.

The four men shared a £10,000 prize money put forward by the Australian government. Australian Prime Minister Billy Hughes, impressed by the potential for aviation in Australia, had offered on behalf of the Commonwealth Government a substantial cash prize for the first aviators to fly an aircraft from England to Australia.





#### THE GOANNA PARK ADVENTURE CAMP DARWIN NT 2019

CAMP DATES: Sat 6 July - Sat 13 July

Goanna Park Adventure Camp is a unique experience offered by Variety NT with its core mission being to challenge teenagers with mild physical or mental disabilities to overcome barriers with an aim to increase self esteem and confidence.

This is achieved through a busy week-long calendar of activities, but also time spent together to develop friendships and express themselves in a safe and very supporting environment. The camp is being held at the Goanna Park Junior Police Rangers Youth facility 90km east of Darwin on the Arnhem Highway.

Admission is open to <u>special needs children all around Australia between the ages of 13-17years old</u> and it is a truly fantastic experience highlighting what the NT has to offer. Once at the camp, the children start the process of settling in and for many this is their first time away from the comforts, routines and limitations of their family life.

The wonderful Variety volunteers soon get them involved in lots of fun activities and doing things they would never have thought they could achieve before arrival.

The camp is operated by experienced organisers and carers and there is a registered nurse on site at all times. The children's safety is paramount at all times.

As the camp is held in the NT's dry season the weather is cooler for camping out. The children sleep in supervised screen tents on a large grassed area.


A variety of indoor and outdoor Territorian activities are provided to keep the children busy from sunrise until sundown and include abseiling, swimming, craft activities and visiting many of the local attractions.

Towards the end of the camp a special talent quest showcases the children's increased confidence. The children unite during the week to practice skits, songs and comedy acts and then present them onstage to much applause.

The positive effects of the camp are far reaching and help nurture determination and resilience when facing life's obstacles, with the children knowing they have accomplished much already and now have a great bunch of friends with which to share their future laurney.

#### **Direct Debit Request Service Agreement**

This is your Direct Debit Service Agreement with MacKillop Catholic College, **User ID 468590**, **ABN 800 4251 2230**. It explains what your obligations are when undertaking a Direct Debit arrangement with us. It also details what our obligations are to you as your Direct Debit Provider.

Please keep this agreement for future reference. It forms part of the terms and conditions of your Direct Debit Request (DDR) and should be read in conjunction with your DDR authorisation.

#### **Definitions**

**Account** means the account held at *your financial institution* from which *we* are authorised to arrange for funds to be debited.

Agreement means this Direct Debit Service Agreement between you and us.

**Banking day** means a day other than a Saturday or a Sunday or a public holiday listed throughout Australia.

**Debit day** mean the day that payment by you to us is due.

**Us** or **we** means **MacKillop Catholic College**, the Debit User **you** have authorised by requesting a **Direct Debit Request**.

**You** means the customer who has signed or authorised by other means the *Direct Debit Request*.

**Your financial institution** means the financial institution nominated by *you* on the DDR at which the *account* is maintained.

#### 1. Debiting your account

- 1.1. By signing a *Direct Debit Request* or by providing *us* with a valid instruction, *you* have authorised us to arrange for funds to be debited from *your account*. *You* should refer to the *Direct Debit Request* and this *agreement* for the terms of the arrangement between *us* and *you*.
- 1.2. We will only arrange for funds to be debited from your account as authorised in the Direct Debit Request.

OR

We will only arrange for funds to be debited from your account if we have sent to the address nominated by you in the Direct Debit Request a billing advice which specifies the amount payable by you to us and when it is due.

1.3. If the *debit day* falls on a day that is not a *banking day*, we may direct your *financial institution* to debit your *account* on the following *banking day*. If you are unsure about which day your account has or will be debited, you should ask your *financial institution*.

#### 2. Amendments by us

2.1. We may vary any details of this agreement or a Direct Debit Request at any time by giving you at least fourteen (14) days written notice.

#### 3. Amendments by you

3.1. You many change\*, stop or defer a debit payment, or terminate this agreement, by providing us with at least fourteen (14) days notification by writing to MacKillop Catholic College:

OR

by telephoning us on (08) 8930 5716 during business hours (8am - 4pm weekdays) OR

by arranging it through *your* own *financial institution*, which is required to act promptly on *your* instructions.

\*NOTE: In relation to the above reference to 'change', your financial institution may 'change' your debit payment only to the extent of advising us, **MacKillop Catholic College**, of your new account details.

#### 4. Your obligations

- 4.1. It is *your* responsibility to ensure that there are sufficient clear funds available in *your account* to allow a *debit payment* to be made in accordance with the *Direct Debit Request*.
- 4.2. If there are insufficient clear funds in *your account* to meet a *debit payment*:
  - a) You may be charged a fee and/or interest by your financial institution;
  - b) You may also incur fees or charges imposed or incurred by us; and,
  - c) You must arrange for the *debit payment* to be made by another method or arrange for sufficient clear funds to be in *your account* by an agreed time so that we can process *the debit payment*.
- 4.3. You should check your account statement to verify that the amounts debited from your account are correct.

#### 5. Dispute

- 5.1.
