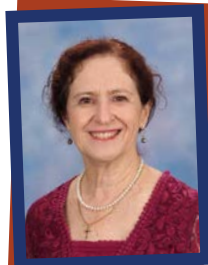

MENINGOCOCCAL VACCINE

The Department of Health has provided the following important information about meningococcal vaccinations for schools to communicate to families:

Meningococcal disease is a rare but very serious bacterial disease. There are 5 main strains that cause meningococcal disease - A, B, C, W and Y. The most common strain currently in the Northern Territory is W.

The best way to protect your child or teenager from getting meningococcal disease is by vaccination. In the Northern Territory children aged 1 – 19 years are eligible to receive a FREE meningococcal ACWY vaccine. The meningococcal ACWY vaccine provides protection against 4 strains of meningococcal disease (ACWY) and is administered as a single dose.

Vaccines are available from your Community Care Centre, Health Clinic and GP practice (GP practice may charge for consultation).

If your child has already received a meningococcal ACWY vaccine (called Nimenrix®, Menveo®, or Menactra®) then they do not need another vaccine.

Meningococcal B is not covered by this vaccine but a course of meningococcal B vaccine is available from your GP with a private prescription.

If you require further information about vaccinations, contact the NT Immunisation Register: 8922 8315.

Debating Competition

Hi,

My name is Michael and I volunteer with an organisation called United Nations Youth Northern Territory which aims to empower and educate students on global issues.

As we have are holding a debating competition called Evatt in a few weeks time, it would be really appreciated if you could put the following information below in your school newsletter. I have also attached a poster which we would like put up around the school and particularly in the English/Humanities faculty.

Our largest and premier debating and diplomacy competition for students in Years 9 -12, Evatt aims to educate young people about Australia's place in the world and empower them as active citizens

May your journey always be filled with blessings and may the life of Saint Mary MacKillop ignite in you the flames of faith and service

by developing public speaking, negotiation, teamwork, research, and diplomatic skills.

The competition takes the form of a mock session of the UN Security Council. Teams of two students debate, amend, and vote on a prepared resolution from the perspective of their assigned nation. The students judged the most effective diplomats proceed to the next round. This year, teams cannot put in their country preferences as country allocations will be decided by the Convenor. From this pool of competitors, the top two most effective teams will then be sent to compete in the National Finals, hosted in Brisbane, Queensland by UN Youth QLD Inc. in December 2019.
