

Dear Families of MacKillop Catholic College,

At the College assembly of Wednesday, I took the opportunity to share with students and staff an incident that was reported to the College on Wednesday morning. The incident involved a Year 8 student and her younger siblings. When these young people got off their bus on their way home, they were approached by an elderly man who was taking their photo and who attempted to engage in conversation with them. Subsequent to sharing this incident with their parents, the matter was reported to police.

The point I made at the College assembly was that this can act as a reminder to us all of what used often be referred to as 'stranger danger'. Again, the point I

made was students (and their families) need to be aware, but not alarmed. I also mentioned that where possible, students should stay in groups and not isolate themselves. Isolating themselves only increases the level of vulnerability of our young people.

Now to update staffing matters, and there have been a few.

Very sadly, I have accepted the resignation of the College's Principal's Assistant, Mrs Vanda Rands. This was a tough one, however, family circumstances have dictated that it was time. I cannot begin to express the depth of my appreciation to Vanda for the strength, support and professionalism she has shown me in my short time here at MacKillop. I do take solace in the fact though, Vanda, that you have made the correct decision, and that, as I mentioned above, the time was right.

We have also lost Di Cook. Di will be returning to Mother Teresa upon her return from Long Service Leave. Mother Teresa has done well. Di, I/we will miss you. You have been an absolute delight to work with. We welcome on staff, Mr Raymond Liebenberg as the College's WHS Coordinator. Raymond has been the recent WHS Coordinator at St Francis Xavier School at Daly River. At the end of Term 1, Raymond and his family relocated back to Darwin, so we have been really lucky to secure Raymond's services. Raymond has rolled seamlessly into this role and is already proving a pleasure to work with.

And for my final piece of staffing news for this week, we are also losing Vanaja Arakkal. Vanaja has accepted a position as the IT person at the school on Mornington Island. In speaking with Vanaja, I know that she is excited at the opportunity of linking her work on Mornington Island with her University Doctoral studies. Busy and successful start to Term 2 for the Saints Rugby League

It has been a busy and successful start to Term 2 for many players and staff involved with Saints Rugby League.

Last Thursday in Week 1 we were fortunate enough to welcome former NRL players, Luke Williamson (Manly/Canberra) and David Gower (most recently of Parramatta) into our

College to deliver our Open age players a course on life and careers post school. Our students took a lot away from the experience, where they found out what the expectations are of an aspiring NRL player from a study perspective. All were shocked after listening to a story from David Gower who now acts in a wellbeing role with the Eel's junior development programmes, when he revealed the fines at Parramatta for being late to training. Many heads turned to the floor when the question, 'how broke would you be if MacKillop brought that in for being late to class?' was asked.

The following day, our u16s Boys team successfully defended their maiden 2020 Eels Cup title by defeating Palmerston College 36-4 in the grand final held at TIO Stadium before the Eels vs Broncos clash later that evening. The Saints opened the scoring with an early try to half, Brandon Norris, who grabbed three for the day. The team walked off to a 22-0 lead at the half time siren and continued on to a comfortable win by the end bell. Other players who kept the scorers busy included Dylan Mugadza with a pair as well as Tyriq Stevens and Izyiah Pairama. Tyriq Stevens is an early candidate for most improved this season and his hard work in training both in the gym and in classes is beginning to pay dividends.

Moving forward, all players are encouraged to sign up to our Term 2 Rugby League Academy programme. The Academy is held during school hours, P5 Monday and Friday. Academy members always hold first preference when it comes to our organised school-based games and tours. Following the cancellation of our Townsville Tour which was scheduled for later this year, we are now looking at taking our Academy members on a playing tour of the Tiwi Islands. Other fixtures currently in negotiations include a Katherine Top End Shield Gala Day for the juniors scheduled in for later this year as well as the Palmerston Cup against arch rivals Palmerston College in the Opens Division.
