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

#### Dear Families,

This represents the last College Newsletter for Semester 1. It also represents my final MacKillop Newsletter. As most would be aware, I was only ever employed in a short-term role as Principal, with my contract finishing at the end of this week. Unofficially, we have already welcomed the College's new Principal, Mr Lucas Hurley, to MacKillop Catholic College. Lucas, however, commences officially in his new position on 5 July.

In previous newsletters, I have mentioned that we are farewelling the College's Inclusion Support Coordinator (ISC), Linda Van Heusden, at the end of this semester i.e. at the end of this week. Linda is relocating to North Queensland.

It is with pleasure that I can announce that Linda's replacement for the ISC position is Ms Janna Bryse. Janna joins us from Victoria. Interestingly, Janna and her family had their plans to relocate to Darwin in place from the start of this year. Janna subsequently applied, and has been successful in her application for the ISC position. Janna, whose teaching specialty area is Art, has her Master's Degree in Inclusive and Special Education. Janna has lived previously in the Palmerston region, and she brings with her extensive experience in the area of special and inclusive education.

This is also the last week we will have with us the College's Business Manager, Amos Wachira. As I have mentioned previously, Amos, together with his wife Cecily and their family, are also relocating to North Queensland. Again, it is with pleasure that I can announce that Amos's replacement as Business Manager to the College is Mr Gary Ninneman. Gary is currently a member of the College's Finance Team, so this Business Manager position has ultimately been filled internally. The College is currently advertising for Gary's replacement position in the College's Finance Department.

I am not sure if I have previously announced this publicly, but I can now officially advise that MacKillop's Deputy Principal Pastoral Care, Mr Michael Graham, will not be returning to MacKillop Catholic College. Michael has officially advised his resignation from this position. Due to a host of reasons, however, this resignation will not take effect officially until later in the year. Again, it is with pleasure that I announce officially that Ms Candice Slingerland has agreed to remain in the position of Acting Deputy Principal Pastoral Care for the remainder of 2021. This is good for the College, because with a new Principal, a new Inclusion Support Coordinator, and a new Business Manager in place for Semester 2, this will provide stability and continuity to the College.

And finally, I need to reiterate a point made in my previous newsletter. Because MacKillop is an open community campus, any persons can enter at any time of the day or night. Dear Families,

We have had some projects running in the background during Semester 1 to roll out for Semester 2 and 2022. In Term 1, we collected some data from students, families and staff

His quest goes viral and he achieves some truly remarkable things along the way, and shows that for an amazing journey sometimes you just need to take the first step.



With still plenty in the plans for the back half of 2021, it is important that students keep an eye on the daily notices for more information about upcoming events and fixtures.







## **Year 7 Agriculture Field Trip** to visit the Taminmin College **Agriculture Program**

On 10th June the Year 7 Agriculture class visited the Agriculture Programme at Taminmin College.

Students were addressed by Mr. Ryan Thornton, head of Agriculture, who gave us a two-hour guided tour of all the enterprises. Ryan provided us with a thorough insight into agriculture, horticulture and aquaponics.

Students were shown the fish farm coupled with a raised vegetable patch which were fed from the nutrients in the fish waste (Aquaponics). The students really enjoyed viewing the Barramundi and Sooty Grunter (black bream) in their tanks.

Students were then able to view and learn about the variety of exotic fruit plants growing in the greenhouse including pawpaw, a variety of bananas and pepper.

The Year 7s viewed the horses, rabbit's hutch and guinea pigs and undertook a more applied study of the chickens, calculating their average weights.

Mr. Thornton showed us the horses and the vegetable garden which was growing many exotic vegetables, some of which we were able to taste. The students learnt more about drip irrigation and its importance for water conservation.

We are very grateful to Sue Healy, Principal of Taminmin College and especially to Mr Ryan Thornton who made us welcomed to return. We plan to visit again during term 4.
