Dear Families,

Today, 8 September, the Church celebrates the Birthday of the Blessed Virgin Mary. This has been part of the Church's tradition for the past 15 centuries and it marks exactly 9 months after the feast of her Immaculate Conception; the dogma which teaches that Mary was conceived free from original sin.

We all take delight in celebrating one another's birthdays. We all have a history and a story to share, and the celebration of one's birthday is a recognition of the unique dimension of that person's life, as it contributes

towards upholding their sacred dignity.

The Church celebrates the birthday of Mary because she is the woman that God chose to be his earthly mother. Mary is the woman in whose womb was conceived the 'Saviour of the World', the God man, Jesus Christ. Mary became, at the very moment of Jesus' conception, the *Theotokos* – the 'Mother of God'. In her *Fiat* – her "Yes" to God – Mary conceived Jesus, and she became the 'Spouse of the Holy Spirit', the 'The Highest Honour of our Race.'

Part of the theology behind why we are invited into a maternal relationship with Mary can be found while Jesus was dying on the cross; he personally gave us his mother to be our mother. "Woman, here is your son," and to the disciple, "Here is your mother." From that time on, this disciple took her into his home." - John 19:25-27 And so, like all good disciples, we are invited to follow Jesus' words, as we take Mary, as our mother, into our homes where we can celebrate her birthday.


have the power to change lives.

As always, please always remember that we are not just a school, but a community, so if you have any questions, please do not hesitate to ask. We are here and happy to help. :)



The Year 10 assembly in Week 6 involved us welcoming Ira Racines from Headspace Darwin in. Headspace is a free and confidential service that can support eligible young people aged 12 to 25 with their mental health and wellbeing. They provide assistance in 4 key areas: Mental Health, Physical and Sexual Health, Alcohol and Other Drugs (AOD) and Vocational Support (Work and Study).

A key focus in our session was on coping with, and understanding anxiety. With assessments, work experience, camps, COVID lockdowns and much more - we understand that these times are challenging and we're happy to compliment the Pastoral Care support offered in our College, with external provider links also. Valuable reflection, resources and reminders were offered to students and saw each of them go home with a 'call card'. In Week 8 we look forward to welcoming Ira back, to do some more hands-on practical activities in addressing and raising awareness about other mental health concerns

Taminmin will be tough opponents, especially at home. "The opening round will be very interesting for a number of very good reasons", Sharp said, adding that, "We've named a strong team, but both teams will be at less than full strength on Wednesday with the local league finals being held on the weekend following. A number of first team players have decided to sit out in preparation for that on both sides".

Coming into Round 1, the Saints plan to be without key players including Catholic Cup captain, Will McCallum, and star halves, Kye Ryan and Osca Bonar. Other unavailable key players for Round 1 include Nate Jarrett-Wright, Taylem Sariago, Alfie Walker, Max Antella, Arman Dharni, Zion Lafele-Selio and Cooper Williamson. "When you look at the list of unavailable players this week, and the team we have been able to assemble, you can clearly see the quality depth the Saints production line continues to yield", Coach Matthew Sharp said. "For me", he added, "the most exciting aspect of Round 1 will be seeing our players go out there and play for a position in the team for Round 2 where we hope to be back at full-strength".

When asked to name players to keep an eye on in this upcoming match, Coach Sharp offered the following names –

Campbell Stolberg – Stolberg is a quality half in the local leagues and will make his Saints debut on Wednesday. With usual halves Kye Ryan and Osca Bonar to return and Harry Heath filling in at fullback, expect Stolberg to have a big game in the halves next to captain, Jack Miller. He won't be wanting to give up the number 7 jersey for Round 2.

Jack Yewsang — Jack has been handed the deputy sheriff badge for the match and it is a well deserved nod from the coach for his good form and quality leadership over his years in the ochre and navy jersey. Expect Yewsang to lead his forwards around the field well and to plug up the middle of the pitch with his high level defensive technique.

Jack Elliott – Elliott missed the Catholic Cup last month with injury and will be keen for a big showing in the backs with Taylem Sariago, Max Antella and Cooper Williamson to return, hot on his tail. Elliott was a standout player in Term 2's Saints League Academy.

Good luck to all teams participating in the Cup and to our players representing their local league clubs in grand finals next weekend.

Growing Up

Patrick was born in Wonthaggi, South Gippsland, Victoria in 1975; the second of six children. Dad has Anglo background mum is first generation from Italy. On a farm he experienced endless adventures herding sheep and cattle on horseback, fishing in the creek, playing footy, cricket and socialising with the farming community. He attended weekly mass with his family at St. Joseph's Church Bass. Patrick completed year 11 and 12 at as a boarder at Salesian College Sunbury where he participated in the Agricultural course. Following school he completed the first year of a Farm Apprenticeship at McMillan TAFE, before going on to complete a degree in Agricultural Science at Dookie Campus of Melbourne University.

Travels North

In 2003, Patrick was deeply moved when reading Pope John Paul II's 1986 Address to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander People delivered in Alice Springs, "And the Church herself in Australia will not be fully the Church that Jesus wants her to be until you have made your contribution to her life and until that contribution has been joyfully received by others." This sewed a seed in his heart and he made a resolution to try to understand what The Pope was talking about and he eventually visited Darwin in 2011.

Faith Journey

He was encouraged by the faith of his Great Aunt, his Nonna (Italian Grandmother), parents and those of his local parish; his faith was always a matter of importance. He started praying the Rosary at boarding school and the following year had a deep healing encounter with the Holy Spirit which lay the foundation for his future. Patrick later worked for 2 years as a full time Lay Missionary with the Disciple's Youth Mission Team. He later worked on the farm and as a personal Care Attendant with the disabled. In 2003 he commenced studies for a Masters in Bioethics at the Saint John Paul II Institute for Marriage and the Family, where they "studied on their knees" and where he grew in love of the

faith and the teachings of the Church. After finishing his Master's, he taught Health Care Ethics at the School of Nursing and Midwifery (and Paramedicine) at Australian Catholic University Melbourne. In Darwin he affiliates with Saint Martin De Porres Catholic Aboriginal Community and Holy Spirit. He is a member of Jesus Youth prayer Group and The Disciples of Jesus Community.


Set in the world of steampunk York in England, our hero Wrench (Wren) and her trusty
