
Dear Families,

On Sunday 21st November, the Church celebrated the Solemnity of Christ the King. This marks the end of the Church's liturgical calendar and this coming Sunday is the beginning of Advent, as we lead up to and prepare for Christmas. Pontius Pilate asked Jesus, "Are you a King?" Jesus responded, "I am a King, but my kingdom is not of this world." (John 18:36) This response from Jesus, raises the question, if he is not the 'king' of this world, then who is? Jesus refers to and describes one who is the 'prince' of this world, "for the prince of this world is coming. He has no hold over me." (John 14:30) This so-called prince is of course the devil, who, when


Farewell and Good Luck to Graduating Saints Alumni

Eli Bamford-Brice


