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PRINCIPAL'S WELCOME

Dear MacKillop Catholic College Community,

The election of Pope Leo XIV marks another significant chapter in the long and storied history of the Papacy, a tradition that traces its roots back over two millennia to the very words of Jesus Christ. This election, like those

tradition, was chosen by Jesus Christ Himselftolead His Church. In the Gospel of Matthew, Jesus declares to Peter, "You are Peter, and on this rock I will build my Church, and the gates of hell will not prevail against it" (Matthew 16:18). This foundational moment not only designates

His role as the visible head of the Church would be filled by his successors, before it, serves as the enduring role of the Papacy in guiding the Catholic Church and shaping the course of history. assuming responsibileach ity for preserving and guiding the faith as the Church grew and spread throughout the world. In the early centuries of Christianity, the Papacy was not without its challenges.

Christians were persecuted under Roman emperors, and the bishops of Rome, led by the Pope, faced immense trials. However, as the Church grew in influence, particularly following the Edict of Milan in 313 AD, the role of the Pope became more prominent. By the time of Emperor Constantine's conversion and the establishment of Christianity as the Roman Empire's official religion, the Papacy had evolved from a persecuted

They can identify where their current efforts sit and pinpoint the next steps they need to take to improve. This fosters greater ownership of learning



and supports a growth mindset across all year levels. Teachers, too, use the walls as part of their collaborative practice—reflecting on student progress and planning support. In every sense, these walls are dynamic learning tools that reflect MacKillop's commitment to clarity, equity, and excellence for every learner.
